## I WILL never become a normal drinker. Because of a mental quirk or a physical allergy, or both, I can't drink. I have completely smashed the possibility that I am, or presently will be, like other people.

Now that the conclusion has been reached that I can't drink, what do I do? I stop drinking. Clearing my mind of all reservations, I formulate a sincere desire for total sobriety--I become willing to do anything to be freed from the obsession of alcohol.

The Program of Recovery as outlined in the 12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous has proved its infallibility in thousands of cases similar to mine. I have come to a state of openmindedness which compels me to accept this positive evidence. Logic says, "Since all other things have failed, why not try this thing which has worked for so many?"

In order to bring about a personality change sufficient to start and maintain recovery from active alcoholism, I had to arrive at a conception of a Power Greater than myself. William

collective addictions, and selfish conduct of its members. I used to believe that joining anything, much less participating in a group, was what people did who were too weak self-help section of our local book or stupid to take care of themselves. Politics was the supreme example of how manipulation, waste, and fraud governed group dynamics. So I was less than thrilled to learn from Tradition Two that some of my choices and behavior in AA would be governed by a group conscience. Growing up, I'd fled my father's drinking by staying away or locked in my room. Twenty years later, at the end of my own drinking. I worked alone, avoided friends and family, and planned to move to a remote part of the state where, I thought, "the real people" lived, with nobody telling them what to do. Furthermore, the claim that a loving God guided the AA group was grounds for grave suspicion.

I found reassurance in the "Twelve and Twelve" and the chapter in the Big Book, "We Agnostics," where passages described the derision I felt toward the failures of organized religions. So I was also willing to admit--as those passages do--that I'd focused exclusively on the faults of religion, and not acknowledged its strengths and triumphs. Some people I knew who were into this God thing definitely had a calmness and contentment I envied. But declaring that a loving God guided group decisions was still too big a stretch for me. It smacked of arrogance and complacence.

Two years sober, I was my home group's secretary and in charge of

our literature. Always a bookish guy. I added new pamphlets and some French translations to the Conference-approved stuff displayed on our table. I also added two paperbacks about alcoholism from the store. I'd enjoyed them, they sold guickly, and the people who purchased them were pleased. So I added a few more.

After three months, the book table at the meeting was half commercial publications and half Conferenceapproved literature. They were easy to distinguish. The commercial literature had bright, eye-catching covers and arresting titles, some about other addictions, Al-Anon issues, alternative approaches to sobriety, and counseling. The AA stuff was all monochromatic, with block letter titles.

I was having fun, people were amazed at the variety, books were selling, and one person even suggested we ought to rename the meeting "The Book Meeting." Boy, was I gratified to hear that.

Then Frenchy, who had ten years, leaned over the table one night and said, "I don't remember the group voting to sell non-AA literature. Did I miss a business meeting?"

"Voting?" I thought he was joking. "People love this stuff. Raffle ticket sales are up because winners can chose anything off the table. We're making money. Everybody's happy. What's to vote?"

I heard out his arguments that, by carrying commercial literature, we were affiliating the group with non-

AA enterprises and taking money from General Service, which is funded in part by the sale of Conference-approved literature. "We're autonomous, and have the right to do that," Frenchy said. "But the group makes those decisions, not the secretary."

Him with his ten years and fancy talk! He didn't see how much my group appreciated all I'd done. "You years before I could look back at want a vote? Fine." I called a business meeting the following week. I'd show this guy.

I could see from the interest when I announced what the meeting was for that it would be well attended. And I was sure the tide of opinion was with me. So I was surprised at the meeting to hear several longtimers voice the same concerns Frenchy had, and dismayed to see the cowed, pensive looks when I presented the facts about our growing treasury, and how people sought this meeting out because of the variety of books I'd provided.

When the vote in favor of retaining only Conference-approved literature tallied twenty-six to one, I was ready to guit. Where were the compliments and support now? This was exactly what I always believed would happen by trusting group decisions: people tell you one thing, then when the chips are down they do another.

My sponsor counseled restraint of tongue and pen, and praying for acceptance. I kept my mouth shut, continued half-heartedly as secretary, but felt hurt and anary, as if

this were something they'd done to me.

In the "Twelve and Twelve," Bill W. wrote a dozen years after the fact that, when his group told him that working AA for a fee at Towns Hospital would put the Fellowship in jeopardy, "The group was right and I was wrong."

I don't know how long it took him to recognize that. It took me a few my own little venture into commercializing AA and say the same thing. Despite their interest in the new books, the group voted in the best interest of AA. They were right and I was wrong.

Today I see that the group conscience overcame in a loving, generous way the shortcomings of the individual, me. I've voted about enough other issues since then to have witnessed how this process absorbs and dissipates the self-pity and resentment drunks like me are capable of nurturing. So I trust that a group striving to live by spiritual principles will achieve a better. higher wisdom (if less than perfect) than I can on my own.

Since I've always been a resultsoriented, show-me kind of quy, I must also admit that the long-term results of these group decisions-preserving the Fellowship--have convinced me that they are indeed the expression of a loving God.

James gave me the key to this problem in his description of the educational approach to a Spiritual Experience. By tapping an unexpected inner resource. I came to believe in a Power which is the source of all things that exist. This Power is present everywhere. It is waiting at all times for us to call It into use, not only in crises, but in the every day problems of living. My awareness of this Power and the knowledge of right and wrong which has come to me is the essence of my Spiritual Awakening.

NEXT, came a personal housecleaning. I had to face and be rid of the things within me which had caused me to drink. I found fear, resentment, dishonesty, selfishness, self-delusion and self pity. The picture of myself disclosed by this process served to destroy a large chunk of alcoholic egotism. The balance sheet set up on me, by me, did not inspire confidence or respect.

IN order to purge my mind of this accumulation of self-inflicted filth. I found it necessary to admit to the Power Greater than myself, to myself and to another person all of the character defects brought to light in taking an honest and fearless moral inventory. When this was done, I experienced a feeling of release. Old tensions which had been active within

me relaxed and died.

I am now living what is for me a new way of life and this makes it necessary for me to be constantly alert. Each day produces errors of commission or omission. I live with total disregard for vesterday or tomorrow. In order to keep the slate clean, I check the events of today and dispose of them to the best of my ability while it is still today.

I have added, or am adding, a third phase to myself. Along with the mental and the physical phases a spiritual element is being evolved. Meditation and prayer, which are almost synonymous, are adding a new sense to the five physical senses. In the morning, I seek direction and strength. At the close of day, I am deeply grateful for all of the good things which have been given to me.

I HAVE found a new and eminently satisfactory way of living. My sense of values has undergone a rather complete transformation. Self is submerged in a desire to be helpful. A beautiful sunset, the stars above or the radiant face of a happy person is more important than money. As a result of the 12 Steps of Alcoholics Anonymous, I have had a Spiritual Experience.


